#### Introduction to the series

Formed by the gospel: the gospel change who we are, and calls us to live according to our new identity.

Today, we will look at the question: how does the gospel shape our purpose in life?

### Idea of the message

The Gospel shapes us by: drawing us to Jesus, making us love and appreciate Jesus, being formed into a living building with Jesus, so that together we help others to come to Jesus.

## The Message

What is	What could be
We look for purpose by nature, we look for purpose: to justify our existence, to answer the question: what does my life mean).	The gospel gives us purpose  It leads us to justify our existence - to seek and find meaning in life by:
<ul> <li>Some by following the rules (of a religion or their own moral code)</li> <li>Others by enjoying life (by breaking the rules)</li> <li>Some in family</li> <li>Others in work</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Coming to and loving Jesus</li> <li>Being part of something bigger</li> <li>Helping others come to Jesus</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Some by doing important things</li> <li>Others by seeking to experience pleasure</li> <li>Some by doing projects</li> <li>Others by being with people/in relationships</li> </ul>	Most of the time, this doesn't happen
Religion = saved and well behaved	Come to Jesus
We think that religion has to do with being saved and being good	Actually, in its essence, the gospel makes us come to Jesus
This doesn't give us purpose, anymore than having house insurance gives us purpose	1 Peter 2.4 It is the definition of being a Christian: to come to

	Jesus
	1 Peter 2.5 In him we find our righteousness before God
	But then, Peter identifies the problem with this definition of "christian"
Jesus is not neutral	hate or love
You can talk about God, and nobody gets offended	1 Peter 2:6-8
But Jesus is different, he causes strong reactions	We love him the gospel (our salvation, the grace of God) makes us love Jesus
	Some people hate him or offended by him
	Some are attracted, others are repelled  • for him, his call, his authority
	So, we come to and love Jesus, but I still don't see my purpose
Individual Relationship	Part of God, part of his body
So far, it seems to be an individual relationship	The same gospel that draws us to Jesus, joins us with all other followers of him
Between God and me. That's why we:	1 Peter 2:9a
<ul> <li>Jump from church to church</li> <li>live isolated during the week</li> </ul>	But, what does it mean to "be part of his body"? For most, church is
A social activity	Living building
We see being "part of the church" as a social activity	What it really means, is that we are formed into a living building
(Sundays)	1 Peter 2:4-6
	<ul> <li>living building</li> <li>example: A casino in Las Vegas</li> <li>Jesus is the foundation</li> </ul>

#### Give to me and take care of me

We assume that the purpose of the church is

- to give me what I need
- Taking care of me
- be like what I like

#### Christians are famous for:

- complaining
- criticizing
- Demanding

## Attracting others to Jesus

The real purpose of this is that together we bring others to Jesus

1 Peter 2:5, 9-12

- We love him, he is precious to us
- We have received his mercy
- He has changed us

This is attractive Like the casinos in Las Vegas call our attention

So, if x, y, and z are true, what should we do?

## **Next Step**

#### Christian

Love Jesus more (read John)

Being in community (participate in community group) Lead others to Jesus other (study My Next Step, I want peace with God)

Non-Christian: Come to Jesus, love Jesus Repent and be baptized, enter this relationship with Jesus

## What will happen

Your life will have purpose

By coming to Jesus, loving Jesus, being built into the living building with Jesus and by bring others to Jesus, your life will have much meaning, eternal meaning.

#### Communion

We celebrate the person to whom we've come; not a service, meeting, church, or group, but to Jesus
