Application: Live grateful and always thankful

Non-Christian: Receive the greatest blessing

- This is an invitation
 - To receive the greatest blessing
 - To be God's child
- You receive this blessing
 - By surrendering to Him
 - o To repent and get baptized
- You would be grateful for all eternity

Christian: Always live grateful

- Develop the habit
 - To be thankful
- To choose to be thankful.
 - o In this moment that you think about something
 - You can go on the normal side of complaining
 - o Instead, choose to be thankful
- In every moment
 - With every person
 - In any situation
- Instead of complaining
 - When you are about to complain
- When you only see the bad
 - At the flaw
 - o Reject it
 - Bite your tongue
- Look at what is actively good
 - At the blessing you have in this very moment
- And be grateful
 - Audibly
 - With words
